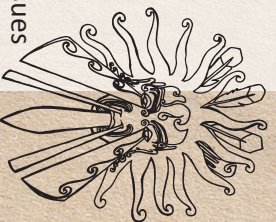


Tā tātou Kaupapa What is EnviroSchools about?

Tautoko - Support A Facilitated Process



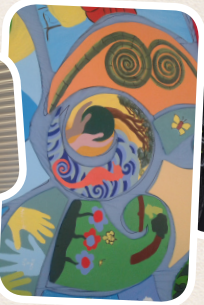
An EnviroSchools Facilitator works with your centre or school, at your own pace, to motivate, support and guide your vision for a sustainable future.

What are our Enviroschools doing?



A wide range of environmental activities are being undertaken in Enviroschools, including waste minimisation, biodiversity restoration, food protection and use, water conservation and care, sustainable energy use and eco-building. In addition, Enviroschools contributes to a broad range of other outcomes including:

- **Citizenship and ecology** such as global connection with nature, interdependence, community responsibility.
- **Educational** such as curriculum engagement, motivation, whole person development.
- **Social** such as healthy eating and physical activity, community, caring, ethics.
- **Cultural** such as connection with tangata whenua, integrating Māori perspectives, pronunciation.
- **Economic** such as financial savings, financial literacy, shifting patterns of spending.
