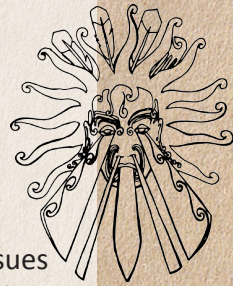

The holistic approach also contributes to a broad range of other outcomes, including:

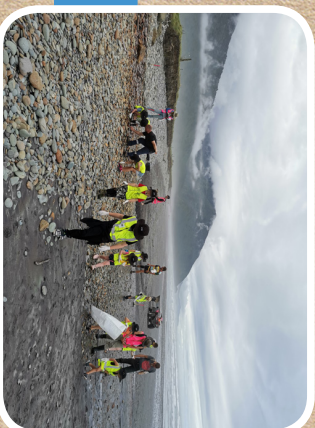
- **Citizenship** - community responsibility, sense of place, active participation in community life.
- **Educational** - student motivation, whole person development, real-life curriculum engagement.
- **Social and wellbeing** - connection with nature, healthy eating and physical activity, community connection, caring and ethics.
- **Cultural** - connection with Tangata Whenua, integrating Māori perspectives and knowledge, use of te reo Māori.
- **Economic** - saving money, financial literacy, buying local and sustainable products.
