After holding a surprise symposium last spring, some of Waiheke's most ambitious birds are again prepping to nest on the Waiheke High School field.

Summery egg laying activities and white-birds have been held by Waiheke High as part of a series of events, leading to legal and ethical permits. Last year, there was an effort to introduce them from the UK. However, it was not until last year that the birds were able to nest on the field.

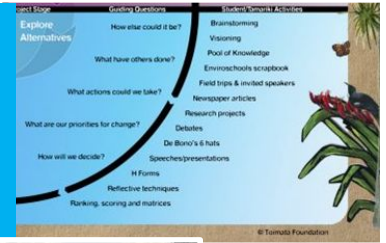

1. *Invite people to share their passions and be informed by these to what actions you decide to take.*
2. *Take up opportunities - especially leadership*
3. *Have a leadership team - 2-3 equally passionate*
4. *Communicate with the community - involve - ask for help*
5. *Leave a legacy - to help it be sustainable*
6. *Meet regularly and set goals taking into account what is happening in the term for the school and individuals*
7. *Advertise your group to grow numbers and let others join*

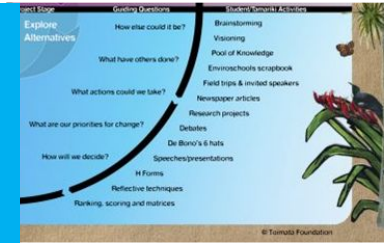
Sit in on secondary envirogroup meetings (The Jennie Method)

- Opportunity to consult on behalf of council eg. Coastal Care plan

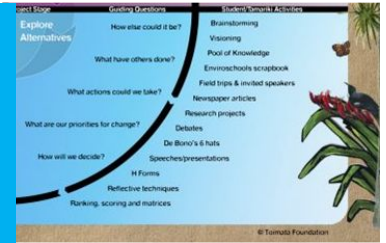

Wellington East Girls' College

Two Enviro prefects are selected to elect and facilitate an Enviro Committee which is the main organising group. They are supported by 2 Enviro Lead teachers. They host Enviro officers - 2 from each junior class and 1 from each senior class. Their role is to spread communications through the school via the form classes.

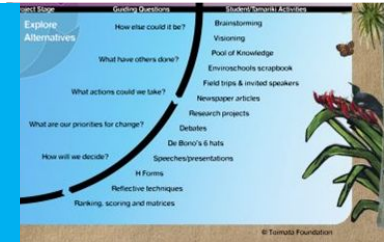
All might be involved with projects eg. Bioblitz - beach clean ups - participating in a photo shoot for Carbon Zero campaign.

Hillcrest High

Environment Captains are selected and sit alongside other student leadership positions. These leaders help select a 15 member Environment Council. There is also a Green team who are people on the group making things happen.

They meet every Friday interval to plan, coordinate promotions, activities, submissions, community involvement and fundraising. Records are kept and actions are documented and shared. Time rewarded by Duke of Edinburgh Awards.

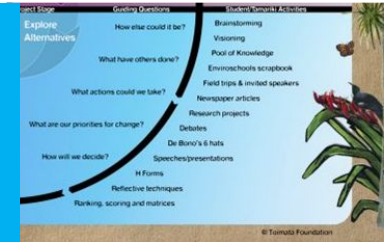

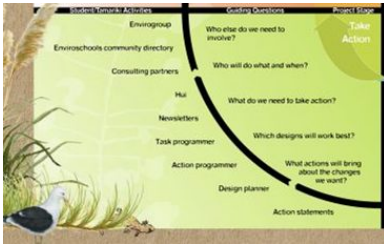
