

At the centre of Enviroschools is the **Action Learning Cycle**, encouraging a tamariki and student directed process of exploration, decision making, action and reflection.




Surrounding and reinforcing this is a Whole School/Centre Approach, where tamariki and students are involved in all of school/centre life, taking action and changing the physical place, practices and ways of interacting in the school/centre.

The four key areas of school/centre life that contribute to creating a sustainable environment and community are:
Place/ Wāhi, People and Participation/
Tangata, Practices/ Tikanga and
Programmes/ Kaupapa Ako.

Throughout the entire programme run five **Guiding Principles/ Ngā Mātāpono**: Empowered Learners,
Sustainable Communities,
Learning for Sustainability, Te Ao Māori and Respect for Diversity.

These guide the whole journey so that tamariki and students participate in a genuine way, indigenous wisdoms and cultural traditions are honoured, and action-based learning becomes the basis for sustainable communities.

Me in My Environment is the core of the Enviroschools programme and involves investigating and understanding the school/centre in the context of its history and ecology.

The learning is focused on developing an understanding of whanaungatanga/inter-relatedness.
